



GOT GAS?

The City of Yonkers is currently experiencing a period of unprecedented investment and growth. Significant new buildings are going up in our downtown, along the waterfront, and near our eastern railroad stations. We are experiencing the most positive growth in generations.

The recently announced moratorium on new natural gas availability threatens to bring this growth to a dead stop.

After meeting with Con Edison and gaining a better understanding of this dilemma, it is clear that our region desperately needs new natural gas supply pipeline infrastructure and it is very difficult to understand why this problem was not addressed years ago. For many years, our local real estate industry has been encouraged to convert from fuel oil to natural gas as a

principal power source due to its positive effect on the environment. Natural Gas is abundant, in fact our Northeast region has an enormous supply of it, so much so that liquified natural gas is fast becoming on of the United States' most significant exports. Why then, should both Yonkers and Westchester be in a position where we are denied this important resource?

We are told that going forward, new gas hook-ups will only be available to customers with interruptable applications, which in short means that those new customers will be denied natural gas several days each year due to extreme weather conditions.

What this will mean to those who want to develop in Yonkers is that construction cost will rise significantly, due to the requirement of providing for

a second fuel source, the increased construction costs make our region far less attractive. This will hamper new development in all areas, residential, commercial and industrial. Areas adjacent to us whether in New York City, New Jersey and Connecticut will look more attractive than us due to lower construction costs and a more available natural gas supply.

It is imperative that our State government act quickly and approve a new natural gas pipeline to our area to rectify this situation as soon as possible.

We assure you that your Chamber will continue to advocate for a prompt solution to this dilemma.



New Member profile: ST. JOHN'S EPISCOPAL CHURCH

Saint John's Episcopal Church Getty Square is a distinguished church building designed in 1872 by the architect Edward Tuckerman Potter. Part of the earlier 1752 colonial church south wall with its Georgian compass windows and door as well as parts of the 1849 transepts were preserved and incorporated in the 1872 church, thereby making it one of the earliest examples of historic preservation in America. The original church was erected with monies provided for in the will of Frederick Philipse II, Lord of the Manor of Philipsburg, and was used as a hospital during the Revolutionary War. Saint John's Getty Square is the oldest stone Episcopal Church in New York State.

Though founded by law in 1693, the congregation began work here as early




as 1684. The first project in the parish was the founding of a school in the Mile Square area of Yonkers. This begins a long history of community service. St. John's and its parishioners were major

contributors in the founding of St. John's Hospital. In recent history this parish was instrumental in founding C.L.U.S.T.E.R., an agency to support people in need, and the Sharing

Community which has helped thousands make the transition from homelessness to mainstream life and providing relief to the hungry, the homeless, and the poor.

The primary mission of St. John's is spreading the Gospel and healing message of Christ's love for the world. In continuing this work, the people of Saint John's Episcopal Church support all who pursue peace and joy through the love of God and neighbor. This year's most worthy recipient of the Above and Beyond Award is Samantha Rosado-Ciriello, President of the Yonkers Federation of Teachers. As a woman born in Puerto Rico, Samantha Rosado-Ciriello is the first minority, specifically Latina, President of the Yonkers Federation of Teachers (YFT). She has worked in the Yonkers Public Schools for 24 years as an elementary teacher, Teacher Center Director and now serves full time as the YFT President. With Yonkers being the fourth largest city in New York State, she has enormous responsibility.

The Yonkers Federation of Teachers is an organization that represents over 3,000 retired and active teachers, teaching assistants, guidance counselors, social workers, psychologists, occupational therapists, Speech therapists, per diem and regular substitutes. In addition, she represents the union on the state level through New York State United Teachers (NYSUT), on the national level through both the National Education Association (NEA) and the American Federation of Teachers (AFT) and currently serves on the AFT's Programs and Policy Council as well as the New York State Commissioner of Education's Teacher and Administrator Evaluation Work Group.

Ms. Rosado-Ciriello uses her educational background, including a Bachelor's in Elementary Education, Concentration in Bilingual and Multicultural Studies, specializing in Spanish; Master's degree Elementary Education, Special Education, Bilingual Education; and a Certificate in Labor Relations from Cornell

University Industrial and Labor Relations Leadership Institute to enhance the lives of educators and children by establishing partnerships with the parents, community, higher education, administrators and teachers to ensure children get the quality education they need and deserve, while advocating for equitable funding and resources, fair teaching practices, safe working conditions, support for special education and English Language services, and promoting social justice issues.

She collaborates with other municipal unions to strengthen the collective voice of labor and is actively involved with AFL-CIO Westchester/Putnam Central Labor Body. Her affiliations with the Association for Hispanic Professionals; Labor Council for Latin American Advancement; League of United Latin American Citizens; 100 Hispanic Women of Westchester and the SOMOS Legislative Conference helps to promote the Latino community, which represents the largest

demographic of students in our schools. In addition, as President, she serves as the chief negotiator for contracts, involving salaries and working conditions, she has advocated for hundreds of members in enforcing their contractual rights in instances both ordinary and serious and she continuously interacts with local and state legislators to insure adequate funding for Yonkers Public School students.

One of Samantha's most important roles is that she is the "face of the union," being the first line when people have questions and concerns.

27th Annual Yonkers Women of Excellence 2019 Honorees

Thomas J. Caramadre, Jr. Humanitarian Award: Bettye Malone

This year's Thomas J. Caramadre, Jr. Humanitarian Award goes to Bettye Malone, Counselor in the Kinship Program for Family Service Society of Yonkers. This extraordinary woman has spent much time giving of herself to others in Yonkers and wherever there was a need. Whether as a performing artist, a teacher, a social worker, an adoptive parent of three older children, or in the many other programs and activities she ran and still runs, Bettye has provided learning opportunities, shared knowledge and wisdom, and enriched the lives of hundreds of families and children.

Bettye, originally from Atlanta, came to New York early in her career to work on Broadway as an actress and singer, while working with the Girl Scouts part time and as a full time English and Social Studies teacher at Longfellow Junior High School in Yonkers.

After a number of years working in the theater and serving on the Council of Actors Equity, Bettye realized that what she wanted most was to start a family. After witnessing a friend's personal tragedy, Bettye vowed to adopt older children. She adopted a ten year old girl and three years later, wanting a sister for her daughter, Bettye adopted two younger sisters, five and eight, who rounded out her family. With the emotional support of some very dear people, she raised

her three children as a single mother, while working full time.

Choosing not to return to teaching, she became a case worker at Leake and Watts Services. Starting as a line worker, she grew to become the Adoption Specialist, Case Worker Supervisor and ultimately Supervisor of the Therapeutic Foster Boarding Home Program. She co-chaired the Bronx Service Panning Area II and chaired the Soundview Community Partnership Initiatives, while training with Dr. Salvador Minuchin at the Family Studies Institute and studied at Fordham University Graduate School of Social Work.

Although Bettye has eight grandchildren, Bettye became the custodian of her grandson, and raised him as a single grandparent while also preserving the relationship between her grandson and his parents. She became involved in the PEARLS Elementary School PTA where she served as Class President for five years, chaired the Enrichment Committee of the PTA and then became PTA President. Her initiative, the Winter Carnival, continues to fund enrichment activities for the children of Hawthorne PEARLS today.

In 2008, Bettye was given the NY State PTA Jenkins Award, an enduring symbol of distinguished service toward the welfare of children and youth. With this award Bettye became an honorary

life member of the New York State Congress of Parents and Teachers.

Bettye encouraged and supported her grandson's desire to be a Cub Scout and subsequently a Boy Scout, where he achieved the rank of Eagle Scout in 2012. Bettye has remained active in the Boy Scouts, where she currently serves as Unit Committee Chair for Troup 4 Yonkers, a Merit Badge Counselor and is a member of the Westchester-Putnam Council BSA Nominating Committee and the Advancement Committee.

Bettye continues to volunteer each year at the Tri-County Science Fair. She has served on numerous boards including St. Andrew's Camp, the Red Cross, the Yonkers YWCA teaching theatre to children and teens, and the Greyston Child Care Center. She is a volunteer for numerous Adoption Agencies, training perspective families in the adoption process. One of her most memorable experience was volunteering at Graham Windham as a visitor for children who had no one to take them off campus.

Bettye enjoys collecting miniatures for her Victorian Dollhouse and researching family history. She is a past member of the National Genealogy Society and the Afro-American Historical and Genealogical Society, Jean Sampson Scott Greater New York Chapter.

Economist Jim Hightower states, "Every dime of minimum wage is spent by its' recipients – circulating upward in our local economies as they increase their purchases of such basics as food, kids clothing and Health Care." Living wages and prevailing wages do likewise.

I am reminded of a quote about tax breaks by Will Rogers, "Give it to the people at the bottom and the people at the top will have it by night fall, anyhow. But it will at least pass through the through the poor fellow's hands.
